The Health System in Aotearoa is entering a period of transformation as we implement the Pae Ora/Healthy Futures vision of a reformed system where people live longer in good health, have improved quality of life, and there is equity between all groups.

We want to build a healthcare system that works collectively and cohesively around a shared set of values and a culture that enables everyone to bring their best to work and feel proud when they go home to their whānau, friends and community. The reforms are expected to achieve five system shifts. These are:

- 1. The health system will reinforce Te Tiriti principles and obligations.
- 2. All people will be able to access a comprehensive range of support in their local communities to help them stay well.
- 3. Everyone will have equal access to high quality emergency and specialist care when they need it.
- 4. Digital services will provide more people the care they need in their homes and communities.
- 5. Health and care workers will be valued and well-trained for the future health system.

Te Mauri o Rongo – The New Zealand Health Charter

The foundation for how we ensure our people are empowered, safe and supported while working to deliver a successful healthcare system, is Te Mauri o Rongo – the New Zealand Health Charter. It guides all of us as we work towards a healthcare system that is more responsive to the needs of, and accessible to all people in Aotearoa New Zealand.

It applies to everyone in our organisation and sits alongside our code of conduct as our guiding document.

Te Mauri o Rongo consists of four pou (pillars) within it, including:

Wairuatanga – working with heart, the strong sense of purpose and commitment to service

Rangatiratanga – as organisations we support our people to lead. We will know our people; we will grow those around us and be accountable with them in contributing to Pae Ora for all.

Whanaungatanga – we are a team, and together a team of teams. Regardless of our role, we work together for a common purpose. We look out for each other and keep each other safe.

Te Korowai Āhuru – a cloak which seeks to provide safety and comfort to the workforce.

These values underpin how we relate to each other as we serve our whānau and communities.

Together we will do this by:

- caring for the people
- recognising, supporting and valuing our people and the work we all do
- · working together to design and deliver services, and
- defining the competencies and behaviours we expect from everyone.

About the role

The primary purpose of the role is to:

This role is primarily based in Wairoa Hospital & Health Centre outpatient service, the enrolled nurse will coordinate the day-to-day delivery of the outpatient clinics and will provide clinical assistance, contributing to clinical assessments to support efficient delivery of outpatient clinics in partnership with visiting clinicians.

The enrolled nurse works in partnership and collaboration with individuals, their whānau, communities and interprofessional healthcare team, to deliver equitable person/whānau /whakapapa- cantered nursing care, including advocacy and health promotion, across the life span in all the outpatient setting.

In this rural setting, the enrolled nurse will be committed to provide culturally appropriate care that will improve equitable access and health outcomes for Māori.

Enrolled nurse practice will seek guidance from registered nurses and other registered healthcare practitioners, as needed

If a patients conditions changes, enrolled nurses will need to recognize the change and are required to escalate finding as appropriate

This role is within a small rural hospital, and it expected that at times the enrolled nurse will be required to work across all nursing areas in Wairoa health centre, including ED and inpatient ward, maternity inpatient unit, and community services.

- Creating a positive experience by welcoming and assisting patients and whanau.
- Preparing rooms for expected patients' arrival
- Preparing patient files by obtaining personal and health information.
- Maintaining patient data records for evaluation purposes
- Performing minor tasks as directed by healthcare professionals, e.g. ECG
- Promoting patient safety by maintaining a clean and hygienic environment
- Supporting good communication between patients and healthcare providers
- Setting up and stocking examination and procedure rooms
- By assisting in the provision of patient care and related activities as delegated by the Registered (RN)
